Wings Night

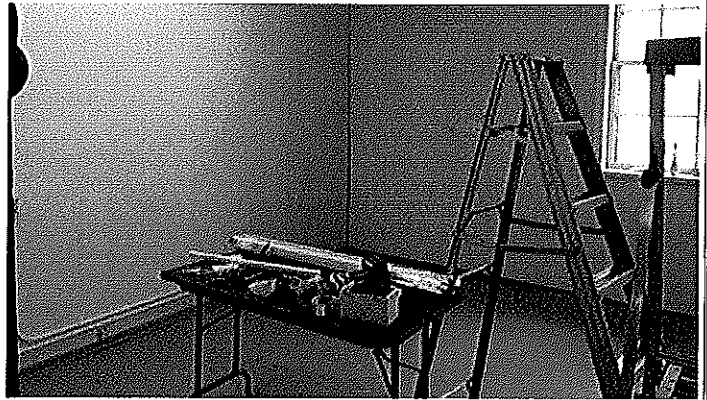
