NO AIR CADETS IN 2011!

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

If you have not been by the hangar in the past few weeks, you will be in for a surprise!

The work on replacing the damaged areas of the south wall, and the insulating and re-cladding have finally begun! Before long, we will have a very different looking hangar - at least from the outside. As you may recall, the roof was replaced last fall. Once the wall work is completed, the renovations will be complete for now. We would still like to replace the main hangar doors, however this may need to wait for a few years in order to raise the funds.

The clubhouse sale has been completed. As you may have heard, the building was purchased by Gary Redhead, who intends to build a new hangar for his fleet of aircraft on the site. While this does bring to a close a two year process, not to mention a piece of RFC history, it was necessary to preserve our main building and operations. You will likely see work on that site begin in the spring.

As you likely heard, we had an incident earlier this month with KGF putting down in a field in white-out conditions. We are all thankful that the pilot, one of our instructors, was not injured and took appropriate actions to ensure his safety. Aircraft can be replaced or fixed, people cannot. Pilot safety is always our first and foremost concern. In this case, the aircraft was significantly damaged, and Tom reports that it will be written off by the insurance company. Our plans are to replace it, likely with another C-172 without retractable gear. While KGF was a good cross-country machine, the maintenance costs on balance with the real need for complex single do not support acquisition of another similar aircraft. We do hope, however, to find a C-172 with a larger engine and capacity that will bring us close to the performance of KGF.

As you might have guessed, the poor weather has hampered our training and rental operations, resulting in a slower than normal winter. Please take advantage when the weather does break, and continue your training or rental flights. I am sure it will pick up soon, but we do have some ground to make up for many grounded days due to wind, snow and poor ceilings.

If you have had aspirations to become a board member please be sure to see Tom at the hangar and attend the Sustaining members meeting at the hangar on March 24. This is your opportunity to get directly involved in the strategic management of the RFC. Likewise, the AGM is coming up on April 21 and is open to all members to learn about the past year, plans for the coming year, and to ask any questions of the board and management. Please make plans to attend.

AIRCRAFT CHANGES

C-GSWM, one of our high time C-150's is being replaced by another C-150 of similar vintage but with about 8,000 hours less total time on it. This aircraft will also be called C-GSWM as we deregistered the older SWM. The early SWM is being parted out. The newer and better radios of the old SWM have been moved to the new model. The new SWM is just about ready to roll out of the shop and should be on line in a week or two.

RFC is also on the hunt for two lower total-time C-172's, one similar to GTM and the second with a 180 hp conversion. Now that the clubhouse has been sold, we can replace LJU. There has been much discussion about the replacement for KGF, our 172RG, but the consensus seems to be leaning to a fixed gear, C-172/180 with a good radio package.


