BRAND NEW TAXI AREAS

Following is a diagram of the new uncontrolled surface areas here at the Regina Airport. Taxiway Charlie, Apron 1 and 2 are now <u>uncontrolled</u> and you do <u>not</u> need to talk to Ground Control to move on these areas. That means you could move freely from the Hangarline, at the Flying Club to Apron 1 and on to Apron 2 without talking to anyone.

The Run-up areas are designated on the diagram on the next page and are as follows:

For runway 31 and 26, you may taxi up Charlie and across Apron 1 to the same Run-up area we have always used. You do not need to talk to Ground Control. News to us recently, is that all of Apron 1 is uncontrolled so all RFC aircraft should taxi on the far West side of Apron 1 between Alpha and Bravo taxiways. After completing your Run-Up, call Ground Control 121.9 for taxi clearance to Taxiway Kilo for takeoff on 31 or 26.

For Runway 13 and 08 you may taxi up Charlie Taxiway and do your Run-up on the taxiway closest to the North side of the taxiway. Once you are abeam the new concrete, that area is considered all part of Apron 1 including Taxiway Charlie where it is abeam the main apron. There is no requirement to talk to Ground Control until you wish to taxi on Taxiway Bravo to Runway 13 or 08. Any aircraft wanting to taxi to the Hangarline will taxi around you on the concrete portion and down Taxiway Charlie.

Special things to remember: Don't enter Taxiway Bravo and Alpha until you get your taxi clearance from Ground. Listen to the ATIS 127.0 and monitor 121.9 as you taxi so if there is any conflict on the main apron between you and an Airline or ground vehicle, you may ask Ground Control for assistance. When you taxi across the Main Apron, taxi where we used to when the Main Apron was controlled, west of the dotted line. The Contact

Ground 121.9 sign on the north side of the Apron hopefully will get moved or covered.


Rumour has it that STARS helicopters will be arriving sometime this year and they will be landing near their new hangar which is next to the new Redhead Equipment hangar. Potentially, they may be putting a landing pad between Taxiway Charlie and the taxiway going past the Redhead and Government Air Services hangar. See the attached map for the possible site.

This may create more conflict issues in the future. The thought of cameras to monitor the blind spots on Charlie and the Hangarline might be a good solution.
