You may have to disable your firewall to download some items. Be sure to enable your firewall again once complete.

LOCAL PROCEDURE REFRESHER

We have been using the new taxi procedures for two years now and still the occasional pilot raises the ire of Air Traffic Control.

We can't emphasize enough that this manner of taxiing first and then getting a clearance is unique to Regina and should not be used at any other controlled airport.

The run-up areas are becoming well known now but do remember once your run-up is complete, you need taxi clearance to move any further. Moving on to Bravo, Alpha or Kilo taxiways without a clearance is not a good idea.

When you do stop for your run-up, please be careful not to block the entrance to Charlie taxiway or Apron Two. Especially on Charlie, move as far as possible to the west from the entrance to Charlie.

Following is a picture of the Practice Area 10 miles to the south and how it is divided up. This has been done for Regina Flying Club training and is not published on any public documents. Student pilots will be training in the sections of the Practice Area but if any renter pilots wish to go there, please ask for a card when you get your keys. The card will identify your area and you will be the only one in that area.

The above procedure has worked with all of our dual and solo training flights. Also, it is necessary to request an enroute climb to the top of the Practice Area which is 5,000. You should also descend in our section and depart the Practice Area for Regina at 3,000'. If you have any questions, ask an instructor.
