YQR - AIRPORT PLANS

Tenants and operators at YQR airport were recently provided with a briefing on the development and progress of plans for expansion and change. The main terminal building and apron will be expanding northward which will eventually result in the closure of Taxiway Charlie to accommodate the expansion. To replace Charlie a new taxiway will be constructed north of and parallel to the old Taxiway Mike. From this new taxiway a new general aviation finger taxiway will also be built northward. Plans also include a surfacing and expansion of Apron IV (currently the gravel parking area north of Taxiway Charlie) and a surface reconstruction of Apron III (the hangar line apron). Construction will be in stages starting in 2015. We will keep you informed as things progress and the impact on RFC operations.

MAIN APRON CONSTRUCTION COMPLETED

The primary project is completed with a few wrap-up items to be finished. During this project we have

been conducting our pre-flight engine run-ups on Apron III. Until we have further discussions with airport operations we will continue to perform engine run-ups on Apron III. Further information will be provided as it becomes available.

WINTER FLYING TIPS

Included in this edition of the AIR SCOOP is our annual Winter Flying Tips publication. Please take a moment to review the information in preparation for your upcoming winter flying. Thank you.

ENGINE RUN-UP PROCEDURES

All of our Cessna aircraft have a standard pre-flight checklist. The engine run-up procedure includes setting the RPM at 1700 and performing various system checks. One check is for the mixture which involves pulling the mixture out to cut-off position to identify that the mixture is operating properly, resulting in the engine starting to shut down. If the action of pulling the mixture is carried out quickly and to the idle cut-off position a rapid drop in RMP occurs as the engine starts to shut down due to loss of

fuel. This rapid RPM drop can be hard on an engine. We would like to have pilots amend the mixture check procedure they carry out as they go through the checklist to involve a gradual mixture leaning action as opposed to a full mixture cut-off. With the gradual mixture leaning some drop in RPM will indicate proper mixture operation, after which the mixture can be returned to full rich for the remainder of the preflight checks.

Further, the conclusion of the engine run-up checklist has the engine power brought to idle from the 1700 RPM position with an application of carb heat to check that the engine does not stall at idle with the carb heat on. For this procedure we ask that pilots bring the power back to idle in a gradual motion as opposed to a rapid action. This will also help to reduce the stress on the engine with the change from high RPM to idle. Thank you for your cooperation in regards to these items.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

To start with, I'd like to welcome our new students who have started ground school. Our instructors are among the best around, and whether you are commercial pilot bound, or looking at aviation as a hobby, they will teach you to be professional in the way you approach flying. Whether you get paid to fly, or pay to fly, approaching each flight as a professional will make you a safer pilot.

Our weather this fall has been reasonably normal. This time of year we expect the odd day here or there where ceilings or visibility curtail our flying activities. On the days when the weather is good, make sure you take a flight and enjoy those nice days as they come. This time of year, a night rating is one of the most useful tools in the toolbox. Winter flying can provide such smooth air, and the visibility at night can be outstanding. It is a perfect chance to take a friend or three on a night flight for dinner somewhere.
