CHANGES TO THE NAV CANADA FLIGHT PLAN

November 15, 2012 will see changes to the Flight Plan format you will be using to file your flight plans. This is to comply with the new International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) standards for flight plans. To see the new changes go to:

MAINTENANCE POLICY FOR RENTER PILOTS

Just a reminder for students and renter pilots, if you have a snag you notice on an aircraft while you are pilot in command, feel free to write it on the pink card so we can deal with it. Here is the important part: YOU HAVE TO TELL ONE OF THE RFC STAFF AND PUT THE PINK CARD ON TOP OF THE WHITE ONE! Once we know of a snag on the aircraft we can deal with it in 3 ways: fix it, resolve it or defer it. Just continuing to fly an aircraft with an unresolved snag even though it is minor, is not acceptable. We must resolve it in one way or another.

If a renter pilot is away from base, a minor defect may be deferred by any licensed pilot, but make sure it is minor and not an airworthiness item. If you are not sure, call the Flying Club office (306-525-6194) for assistance.

STAFF CHANGES
